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## 12.Nov.2012




We were admiring the sunset from the 9th floor of the Building 1 of Faculty of Science.


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But what's this shadow?



We went up to the 11th floor and saw this. Yamamoto-kun suggested if that thing creating the shadow is Mt. Fuji.




That distinctive pair of buildings is clearly the Shinjuku Tocho.


But is the thing behind the mountain or clouds?
